Letter From the President

Talk about a sweet deal – just in time for Valentine's Day the Library is announcing expanded hours. As Rich's *From the Director's Desk* explains, beginning on February 2, the Library will open at 9AM on Monday-Friday. To celebrate this extra hour of service, the Friends of the Library will be offering a special treat. Visit the Library between 9-10AM during the month of February and the Friends will offer free coffee to adults and a free book to each child. Parent discretion applies to coffee for the kids....

We hope you will join us for this expansion, inspired by feedback we've heard from the community that opening earlier would be appreciated.

The Library is seeking your continued feedback in a very specific way for the next month or so. In January, the Library began a formal strategic planning process, organizing a series of forums for input. To assure we can receive maximal input, everyone is invited (and encouraged) to complete a brief survey. When you have five or ten minutes to spare, please go to the homepage of the Library's website to link to the survey and tell us what you like about the Library and what would make the Library even better in the future. All comments and suggestions are welcome.

I would be remiss to focus only on the future and not celebrate our successes in 2014. In the year that just was, patron visits totaled nearly 119,000, a rise of 4.2 percent compared to 2013. Computer and wi-fi usage was particularly notable with a 27.1 percent rise. In addition to the traditional books, magazines, and Internet offerings, visitors are increasingly taking advantage of the expanded electronic offerings, such as music download and e-books. Library staff are ALWAYS happy to help you learn about new options and how to use them on your personal devices, such as smart phones, laptops, and tablets. 
human history is coming to a close. **On The Beach** tells a message that will resonate as long as the world has the power to self-destruct at its own fingertips. (source: MGM pr release).

Story: By the time of her death at age thirty-four, Lorraine Hansberry had created two electrifying masterpieces of the American theater. With **A Raisin in the Sun** she gave this country its most movingly authentic portrayal of black family life in the inner city. Barely five years later, with **The Sign in Sidney Brustein's Window**, Hansberry gave us an unforgettable portrait of a man struggling with his individual fate in an age of racial and social injustice. From the Director's Desk

We are pleased to announce an increase in business hours to make visiting the library more convenient for patrons who would like to get going earlier in the morning. The Library will be extending its hours by opening an hour earlier, at 9:00 AM, on Monday February 2nd. The new hours will be 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM on Thursday, and 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM on Saturday.

The increase in hours follows an expansion of Saturday hours in 2013 when closing time was extended from 2:00 to 5:00. We try to provide access to the library's services and facility as much as possible. This improvement is another step in that direction, and is based on observing patrons arriving at the library before 10:00 only to find us closed. We are fortunate to be able to increase our hours without impacting the taxpayers thanks to generous private support for the library. If you are a supporter of the library, thank you very much.

To help publicize the 9:00 opening time, the Friends of Blue Hill Public Library are offering a free cup of coffee to any patrons who come to the Library between 9:00 and 10:00 AM during February and any child who

comes during that time will receive a free book of their choosing, also from the Friends of the Library.
